

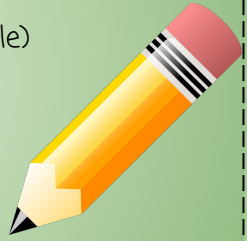

Safety Protocols



- Students, staff and visitors will be required to wear masks (or other face covering that covers both the mouth and nose) in common areas and where social distancing is not possible.
- Anyone entering the building will be screened for Covid-19 symptoms and temperature, including bus and car riders each morning.
- Social distancing and directional signs have been placed in hallways.
- Hand washing is encouraged and will be scheduled several times throughout the day.
- Hand sanitizer stations are located throughout the building and there is hand sanitizer in every classroom
- Students may bring their own reusable water bottles to class for water only.
- There is a designated area for students who exhibit Covid-19 symptoms to wait for a parent.
- Lockers will not be issued to students this year.

Media Center

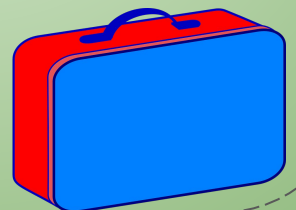


Students may reserve books through the Instabook process ahead of time. Books will be delivered to students in their classrooms.

There will not be Media Center visits at this time.

Breakfast and Lunch

- Breakfast will be "grab and go" meals that students will take to classrooms to eat.
- Most students will eat lunch in the classroom. Teachers may take students outside for lunch if weather permits.
- **Students will not have access to microwaves during lunch.**
- **Food cannot be delivered or dropped off for students.**
- Breakfast and lunch are FREE for all students for the remainder of the semester.

- Social distancing markers have been placed in serving lines and on seating in the cafeteria.

Building Hours:

8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Students may not be dropped off prior to 8:00 a.m.

All students MUST be picked up no later than 3:45 p.m.

Sanitation Procedures

- Signage is placed throughout the building and in all restrooms encouraging frequent hand washing.
- Classrooms are thoroughly sanitized daily.
- Students will clean desks with hand sanitizer at the end of each class period.
- "High-touch" areas will be cleaned multiple times throughout each school day.
- Restrooms are cleaned at least three (3) times per day.
- Water fountains will be closed
- Extra masks will be available for students who lose or soil theirs.
- Band instruments will have bell covers on instruments OR students will be provided with specialized masks.
- Chorus students will be given face shields to use while singing.
- There are multiple hand sanitizing stations located throughout the building.



In-Person Instruction

- Teachers will teach both in-person and remote students simultaneously.
- Assignments will continue to be given through Google Classroom; there will be VERY limited paper/pencil use.
- Students may not share supplies.
- RCD Units and Georgia Standards of Excellence will be used for instruction.



Visitors

- Visitors to the building will be very limited.
- All parent conferences/meetings will continue to be held virtually.
- Any in-person meetings must be approved by the principal.
- For early dismissals, parents will use the videocom system to show ID and should wait outside. School personnel will escort the student to the door.

Car Rider Arrival Procedures

- Arrivals begin at 8:00 a.m.
- Students should exit the car quickly with mask covering nose and mouth.
- Parents will remain in the car and wait for student temperature check.
- Students will follow the Mustang hooves on the sidewalk to the temperature check station.
- As soon as a student is cleared, the will signal for parents to move forward.
- Parents will not be allowed to bring students into the building.



Car Rider Dismissal Procedures

- Each car rider will be given two numbered tags. If families need a third tag, they can be purchased for \$2.
- The tag should be clearly visible through the front windshield of the car.
- Drivers should remain in the car and keep windows up.
- The parking lot attendant will call for the student to be dismissed.
- Parents will be directed where on the loading zone to wait.
- Students should load quickly to avoid traffic back-ups.

Protocols for Wearing of Masks/Face Coverings

- All students, staff, and visitors must wear a mask or face covering at all times in common areas and when social distancing is not possible.
- A face covering is defined as a cloth material that covers both the nose and the mouth. For safety purposes, bandanas are not considered an appropriate face covering.
- Every student will receive two (2) reusable masks on the first day of school.



Discipline Consequences Related to Masks/Face Coverings

Masks are considered to be a required component of the student dress code policy.

If a student forgets or loses a mask or face covering, a disposable replacement will be given to him or her and parent will be called.

If a student refuses to wear a mask, progressive discipline measures will be utilized. These measures may range from a parent conference to removal from the in-person learning environment for the remainder of the semester.

What to do...

If I don't know where to go
On the first day of school.

There will be staff members in the Hallways to help you find your way. We will be wearing green!

If you need a schedule

There will be a staff member in the Front of the school and in the cafeteria who can direct you to your Advisory classroom. You will receive your schedule there.

If you need breakfast

You will follow the "distance dots" to the cafeteria and pick up breakfast and proceed to your first class. You will eat in your Advisory classroom.

If you need to drop off
Medication

The nurse will be stationed at a table near the front entrance to collect medication From parents on the first day.

If you forget or lose your mask

Ask your teacher for a mask and he or she will get you a disposable one from the office.

If you need to see the Counselor

Fill out the Counselor Request Google form and Ms. Barkley will come get you from class.

If you feel sick during the day

Let your teacher know immediately. She or he will alert the office and the nurse will meet you in the back hallway.

If you need to see an administrator

Let your teacher know and he or she will alert the office. An administrator will come to your classroom to talk to you.
